Trojans Win at Louisburg College

Mount Olive College Trojans pulled away in the last five minutes to drop Louisburg 62 to 54 in a Tarheel-Cavalier conference game in Louisburg Saturday night.

Mount Olive, who was in front most of the time, baited Louisburg along until pulling away late in the game. Dennis Pierce's two free throws put the Trojans in front for the night at 50 to 48 and they built up the winning margin.

Pierce took high scoring honors in the game with 18 while Billy Lee had 15 and Wayne Patrick 13. Joe Penland was tops for Louisburg with 17 and John Lewis added 11.

The victory gave Coach Bobby Frank's Trojans a 4-3 conference mark and a 11-7 overall record. MOC, who visited Wingate Monday, will be at Chowan Thursday night.

Coach Frank announced that Mount Olive picked up forfeit victories last week over Sandhills and College of Albemarle, who had defeated the Trojans

when he hit from the side. They maintained a four to six point lead until Louisburg tied the score at 48-up. Pierce put Mount Olive back into the lead and they stretched it to 62 to 54 when the game ended.

Mount Olive and Louisburg exchanged points early in the game when Lee tallied five of the first seven Trojan markers. But the Hurricanes took the lead at 9 to 8 and opened up a 18 to 11 gap.

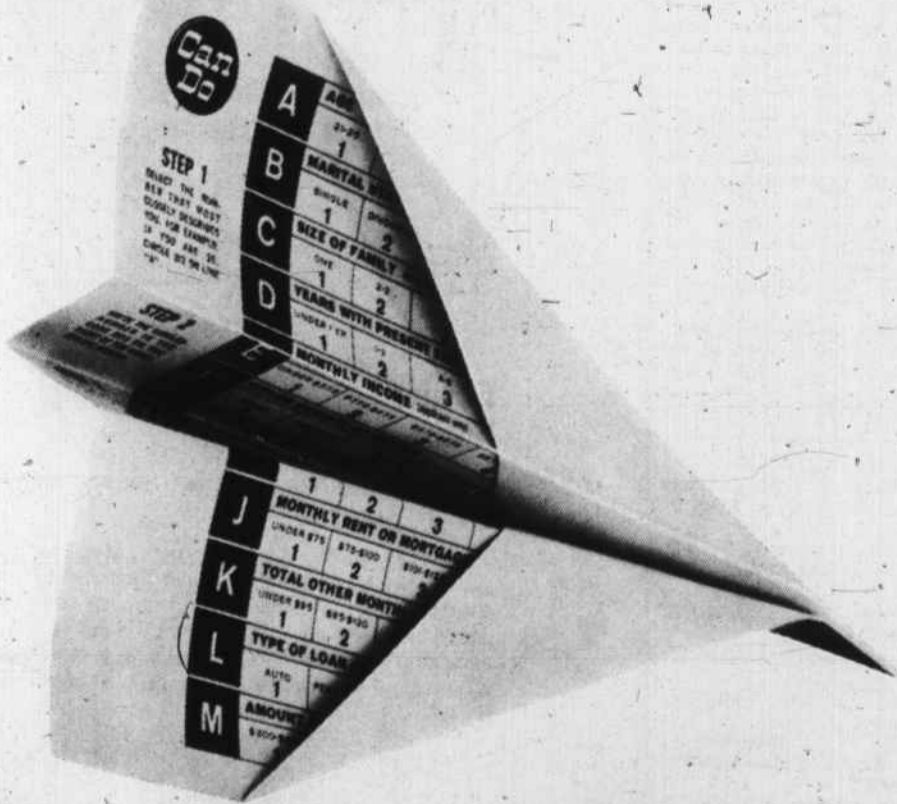
