## Revival



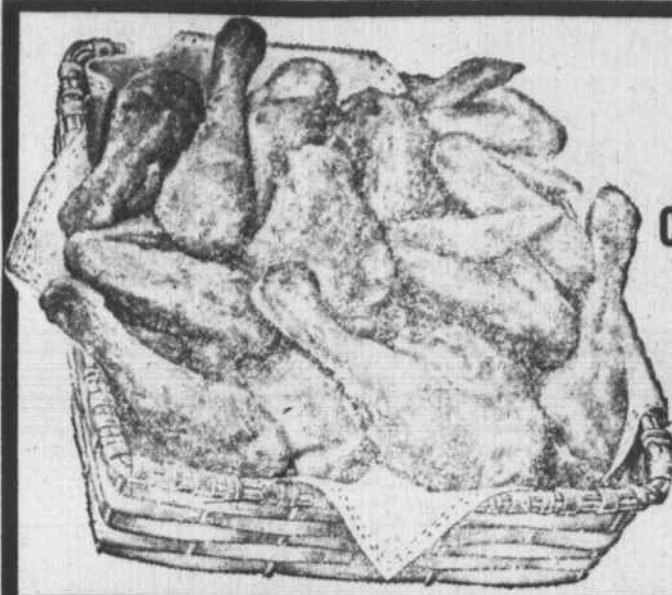
REV. P.G. BUNN

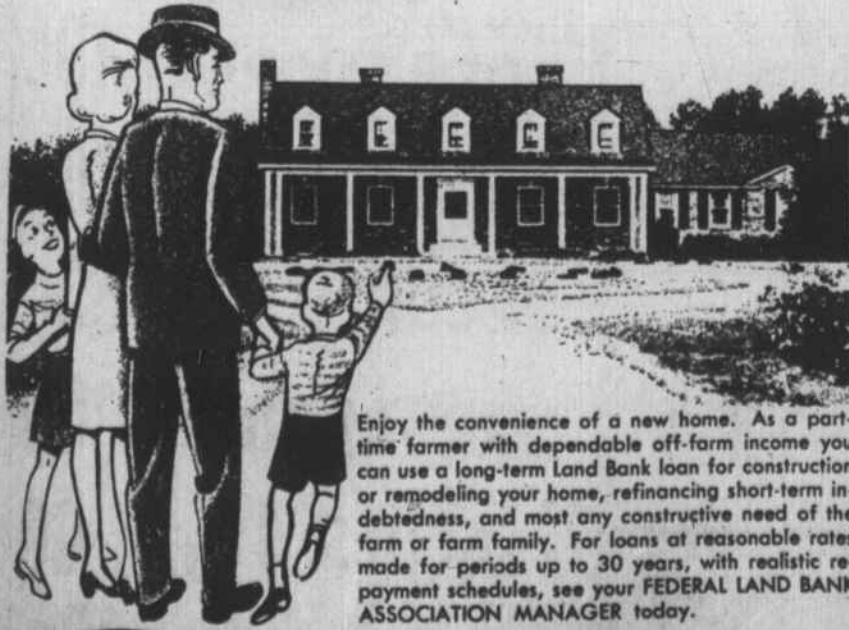
