Defense Secretary Melvin R. Laird plans to seek changes in military law determining one month's unauthorized absence by a serviceman evidence of intention to desert. The present law now stands, no matter how long a serviceman is AWOL, that in itself is not enough to support a desertion conviction.

The Nixon Administration plans to ask Congress for legislation allowing the use of U. S. marshals or federal troops to put down campus riots. The plan would let college administrators go to federal courts for help in opening campuses by dissident students.
