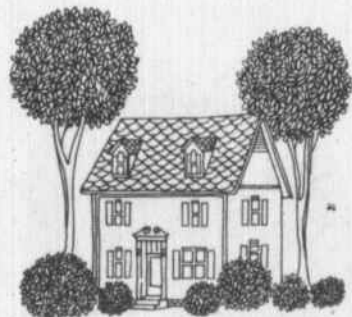
## Executive Board Meets
