Franklin Game Law Explained

Wildlife officials have issued a reminder to hunters of the law passed by the recent General Assembly relating to hunting from public roads in Franklin County.

The law, Senate Bill No. 501, passed last May prohibits anyone from taking or attempting to take "any game animal or game bird from any public highway, public road,

or public right of way without first securing in writing permission of the owner of the land which abuts said public highway, public road or public right of way."

The law applies to a particular area of Franklin County which is described in the law as follows: In the area bounded by the Warren County line on the North, the Nash County line on the East, Sandy Creek on the South and US-401 on the west. It also states, "The prohibition herein contained shall include the north side of U. S. Highway 401 between the Warren County line and Sandy Creek."

At the same time, the Commission reminded hunters that those over 65 years of age must apply directly to the Wildlife Commission, Box 2929, Raleigh on forms available at license agents and the

Commission office. Hunters were also reminded that licenses for big game are required in addition to the regular hunting license.

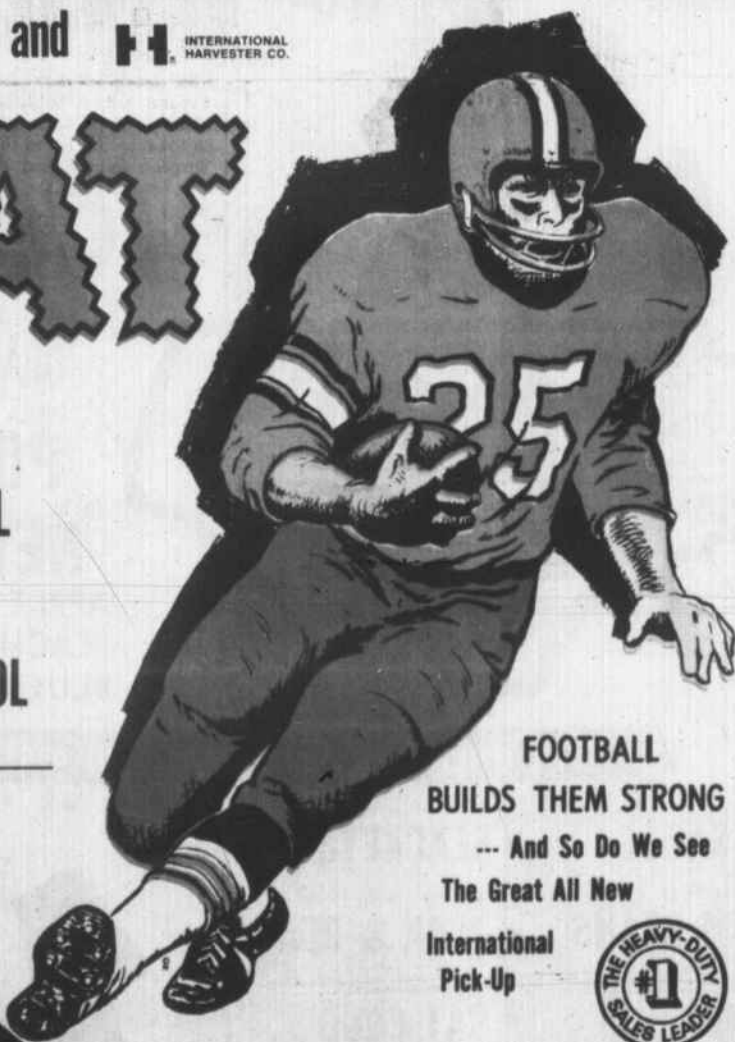
