John W. Grant Retires From Snow Hill ASCS

John W. Grant, Greene County Agricultural Extension Chairman, submitted his resignation to become effective immediately to the Board of Commissioners at their regular meeting Monday, November 3, 1969.

Mr. Grant expressed his appreciation to the Board and other farm leaders in the county for their continued support during his 32 years of service in Greene County, stating he had never regretted coming to Greene County because he had always found a fine and cooperative group of people interested in farming and the things he had tried to promote.

Mr. Grant is a native of Northampton County. He graduated with honors from N. C. State University in 1936. He sought vocational Agriculture at Lenoir High School before coming to Greene County as Assistant County Agent in 1938. He was appointed County Agent in 1948.

A member of Calvary Memorial United Methodist Church, now serving on the Administrative Board, a member and past President of Snow Hill Rotary Club, a member of the State and National County Agents Association, he received the Distinguished Service Award from this organization in 1959. He is also a member of the Greene County Farm Bureau.

Mr. and Mrs. Grant will continue to make their home in Snow Hill.

Mrs. Grant is the former Frances Person, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. M. M. Person, Sr. of Louisburg, and sister of M. M. Person, Jr., Emily Burt Person of Louisburg and Mrs. C. L. Revelle of Murfreesboro.
