

# Pergerson, Williams Named To All-Area Team

The Louisburg Bulldogs were not surprisingly named No. 1 team in the area covered by The Durham Morning Herald in that newspaper's annual all star picking released this weekend. The news-

paper covered only the Franklin Area Conference in Class A football. The locals finished the season with a perfect 3-0 conference record, captured the title and finished out the year with an

8-3 record, losing to Weldon in the district playoffs.

Edward (Boo Boo) Pergerson, offensive guard and outstanding defensive linebacker of the Bulldogs, was named to the All Area defensive team. Franklinton's standout end and back Cliff Williams was also named to the defensive squad. Tim Jones, Oxford Orphanage speedster and top scorer in the FAC was also named to the defensive squad. The listing included such outstanding players as 4-A State Champions Wilson's Carlester Crumpler, most sought after prep player in

the state. The listings covered an area from Kinston to Pittsboro and also included all classifications.

Louisburg's Randy Seidel joins Franklinton's Bob Kearney and Oxford's Jones in the 13 member Ten-Touchdown club. Jones had 13, Seidel and Kearney had 10 each. Wilson's Crumpler led with 26.

Louisburg is rated ninth and Franklinton is rated 23rd among the top 24-offensive teams in the Durham Herald area. The Bulldogs scored 254 points, the Rams scored 204. The top is Wilson Fike with

409 reflecting Crumpler's amazing year.

The Herald's feature page on Prep Sports also listed the Bulldogs as averaging 23.1 points per game while giving up 10.3 points per contest. The Rams scored 20.4 points per game and allowed 10.2 to be scored against them.

Offensively the 'Canes had good scoring balance as all five starters scored in double figures. Bowden led the way with 21 followed by Wilson's 19. Larry Paschall's 18, Richardson's 15, and Davis' 10. Team play was further evident in view of the fact that the 'Canes had 21 assists for the game. Davis had seven assists and Paschall six as the

ball handling in the second half was nearly perfect.

Bowden popped in eleven of eleven free throws enroute to one of his better games of the young season. Wilson had by far his best game, hitting on seven of twelve shots from the floor and on five of eight from the line.

The 'Canes had problems shooting in the first half as they hit on ten of thirty-two attempts, but in the second half with Paschall engineering the attack the offensive play was much smoother.
