


When these states

and three in Indiana." When these states were redistricted, in 1870, the republi-can legislature so arranged them that even on a close aggregate vote they would secure a large proportion of the congressmen. This was done by making a few districts in each state largely democratic, so that in the congress elected mocratic, so that in the congress elected in 1872 Ohio had only five democratic representatives, and Indiana three. In the "tidal wave" which swept over the country in 1874 the democrats in each of these states succeeded in carrying several republican districts. It was ex-pected that upon a full vote these re-publican districts would be recaptured by their native and the expectation has publican districts would be recaptured by that party, and the expectation has been partially verified. But these gains do not ensure a republican majority in the next house of representatives, as the democrats have a large margin to go upon, and will of course make a vigor-ous fight to retain their ascendancy in that body.

A CANDID CONFESSION.

In a conversation, the other day, Gov. Hayes said ; "On the question of finance, the reumption act and the necessity of reform, we will be badly beaten. We must wave the bloody shirt, and revive the bitter projudices of the war." In uttering these sentiments he struck In uttering these sentiments he struck the key note of his party. This has been their policy throughout the cam-paign. They have dodged the real, living issues of the day, and, shrinking from their discussion, have bent their energies to inflame the passions of the northern people. They have determin-ed to make their fight a hitter and vindictive one-a war of hate. They have accordingly, in Indiana, the great bet-tle ground of this compaign, refused to meet the democrats in joint discussion. Even Morten, the Great Sitting Bull, who carries the brains and the malice of the republican party, avoided Dan Voorbees, in the campaign just closed there, as he would the devil.

The Indianapolis Sentinel states that Hon. Jas. B. Ryan, the democratic judge in the fourth ward of that city, at the recent election, stood two nights the recent election, stood two nights and three days without a moment's sleep or rest, nursing the ballot-box that no fraud should be perpetrated if he could prevent it.
