

The Coming Fete in Paris.

PARIS, July 12 -The papers say that the lete of the revolution and of the republic, which occurs on Thursday next, the 14th instan', (the ninety-first anniversary of the taking of the Bastile) will be celebrated with greater eclat than it was last year. The city has already assumed a semi-festive appearance. The official buildings are respiendent with bunting, while everywhere is visible the outlines of what will develop into brilliant illumivations. Huge fing staffs have been erected on all the open spaces. There will has a splendid Venetian *jete* in the Bois de Bologne, with bands of music and fireworks on the lakes. There will also be pyrotechnic displays at Montmartre, Belleville, Point du Jour, and other conspicuous points, and free performances at the theatres.

BALTIMORE, July 12 .- A Sun's special letter from Westminster, Carroll county, dated yesterday, says: Robert Bell, col ored, died in this city last night, aged somewhere in the eighties. His life was known to have been insured for a large aggregate sum and his death and insurance policies were the chief topics of conve sation to-day. Quite a number are inter-ested in the policies and the whole amount is estimated at over \$200,000. It is said that \$174,000 have been taken on his life in the past two or three weeks, one syndicate inesting in \$55,000. Bell has been sick about six weeks. He was a staunch Democrat, voting the straight ticket at every election since the fitteenth amendment clothed him with the elective franchise.


