Capt. B. H. Buen needs no comment or introduction at my hands to the peuple of the Metropolitan district. His late strong and effective campaign has spoken to them clearer, louder, more tenderly and more lastingly than I ever can. But of the period between his early manhood and the campaign of 1884 I now desire to speak briefly.

Fired with all the noble emotions of a young and brave heart, in June, 1861, he voluntecred as a private, being yet only 16 years of age. Unswerving de-votion to duty and undoubted courage, though always kind and generous, soon officials and men, many of whom still live to honor him, and in August, 1862, he was promoted to a 3d lieutenancy, after wards to a 2d, then to a 1st, which pesition he filled to the close of the war. In 1865 he was elected colonel of the 32d N. C. militia, not yet 21 years of age. In 1868, when Wilson and Nash were put in the same senatorial district, he was nominated first by Nash convention and Gen. Joshua Barnes by Wilson, but being ineligible—not yet 25 years of age—he withdrew his name before the committee of conference met. Devoting himself then for a short season to the profession of law and having already become one of the ablest and most successful advocates at our bar, in 1875, when the "Canby constitution" was bearing so heavily upon us, when clouds were still lowering and impenetrable, when bankruptcy and ruin seemed inbe seen in the far distance, except through a change in our organic law, he was nominated for that convention

and elected by a large majority. Returning to his profession, he desired uninterrupted quietude, but in 1882 the sun of the "Nash county Democracy" neared the verge of eclipse-the staunchest began to falter-independentism had already a strong hold and threatened to undermine and overthrow our party, and at this important juncture. as if by inspiration, all eyes turned anxiously to Bunn. Recognizing the importance of the hour, he entered the field to win, regardless of work or cost. From every stump his strong and touching appeals went forth and brought in return a gloricus victory. He was not only elected to the legislature, but our entire field was swept clean once morea "Waterloo defeat" given to the Philistines thus it will be observed that he is no ordinary man, having proven equal to every emergency. Owing to the war he never had the advantages of a collegiste education or went to school a day beyond the limits of his own county, but yet his apt and giant mind, having to grapple with the stern realities of life, has acquired a thorough business education, and he stands today one of the most thorough and successful business men in eastern Carolina. Then, Mr. Editor, in conclusion, if we want a vigilant, ready and useful member: if we would march to "certain victory" if we would honor old Nash, born amid the smoke and ares of the revolution and ever as true to Democracy as the needle to the pole, nominate Bunn for
