

I have recently received a letter from a gentleman in western Texas, about 150 miles from Waco, who is the editor of one of the weekly newspapers published in his town, and supprising that his account of things out there will interest some of the dissatisfied among your readers, I send you some extacts:

"I have moved from - to the -

magic (?) city of the West. The sale of lots took place not thirty days ago and we have something like eighty places of business. There are probably in the place 2,500 people and about half of them will know where they will get their breakfast in the morning. It is wonderful to see the confidence with which fools rush into this country, expecting to build flourishing towns where there is nothing to support them. The champion hars of North America can be found in west Texas. We have an editor in this place who describes in glowing terms the resources of this desert-calls bald, bleak prairies where the growth is hardly as long as the wool on a blanket, 'evergreen valleys of long, luxuriant grass,' and speaks of some green slimy mudtoles near town as 'pure, crystal and ever-running water.' Unfortunately he prospers. I try to tell as few lies as possible and they say I don't puff the country enough. Land agents, specula-

or starve. \* \* \* \* "I had been reading in the papers of the fine crops of cotton in - county, and when I went to that county I looked in vain for the cotton-If the whole county makes enough to weave into a Martha Washington handkerchief I am wofully deceived. \* \*

We must have immigration; we must induce all the dissatisfied in the east to sell out their comfortable homes and come out here to stay a year or two and go back penniless; we must assist a few land-thickes." \* \*

"One of the greatest curses of the age is the private ownership of uncultivated and uninhabited lands. I have heard of scores of families who moved to this country, tried to raise a crop on land that some robber in California, Illinois or Massachusetts demanded three or four dollars an acre for, atterly failed and returned eastward to beg or steal."

"How I would enjoy spending the

summer in your county! While you are feasting on peaches, apples, pears, melons and grapes, we send to California for a few canned fruits of last year's growth. There will be nothing grown in this section except a few watermelons and calves. In some parts of the county When Cyrus was king there was seldom a a good rain has not fallen since 1885."

The writer of this letter is my son, living in Runnels county. He was born and raised in Huntsville, Walker county, but came to North Carolina and staid with me from his 16th to his 21st year, when he went back to Texas. B. F. GRADY.
