CONGRESS. PROCEEDINGS YESTERDAY IN SENATE AND HOUSE.

LIVELY DISCUSSION IN THE HOUSE OF THE TARIFF-THE INDIAN APPROPRIATION BILL.

WASHINGTON, April 14—House.—Mr. Randall, from the committee on appropriations, reported the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill, and it was referred to the committee of the whole.

The committee on Public Lands reported back the Senate bill to relieve the purchasers of, and to indemnify certain States for swamp and overflowed lands.

A bill was reported and placed upon the calendar for the erection of a public building at Charlotte, N. C. The pension committee reported with amendments the Senate bill granting pensions to ex-soldiers and sailors who are incapable of the performance of manual labor.

The Indian bill was then considered by sections. An amendment was adopted adding \$20,000 for an independent band of Sioux in Minnesota. Without finishing consideration of the bill the committee rose and the House at 6:10 adjourned.
