GEN. R. B. VANCE DEAD.

#### He Passes AWay After a Lingering Illness Tuesday Morning.

Special to News and Cherever. Asheville, N. C. Nov 28 Gen eral Robert B. Vance died at his home this morning after a lagrang illness. He will be buried with Masonic honors Thursday after noon. General Vance was a broth er ef Senator Zebulon Bar d Vanco

In 1848 he was elected cook of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Seamons for Buncombe county. Thus position he held for eight years, then declined re-election to enter the merchantile business in Asheville.

When the war broke out he ra god a company, Boncombe Lafe Countde, and was elected captain of it. Then when ten companies were mustered at Asheville he was elect ed celonel. This was the 29 h North Carolina regiment. Colonel Vance commanded it at the battle of Murfreesboro and in several cugagements of Camberland Gap. His horse was killed under him at Murfreesbore, and was complimented for gallantry by General McComm

In 1863 Colonel Varice ful .ll with fever and his regiment was sent to Miss as ppi lie never commanded it again. The following is a statement made to the directors by the physicians that have been in attedance at the Nermal:

"November 28:h, 1899. "Gentlemen. After a careful examination of the records. and patient review of the history of the sickness at the State Normal and Industrial College since October 6th we find that there have been two distinct epidemics. The first beginning about October 24th, purely malarial in character; the second, beginning in the second week of November, distinctly typhoid, though complicated in one-third of

the eases with malaria. "There have been in all about one hundred cases. Of these 70 per cent were primarily malarial and 60 per cent, malarial only, all recover-

ing in from four to ten days. "Of the remaining 40 per cent., 10 per cent, after having had m .laria, were infected by the typhoid poison, while the remaining 30 per cent seem to have had primary ty phoid infection. In view of the severity of the typhoid poison, it is surprising that so small a percen tage of the students were infected.


