Between them we would not give a copper for office. Equally pure, upright, honorable, incorruptible, they would not do all for themselves as Senators in the Congress of the United States. But they ought not to be allowed to distract and disorganize the party which is the only hope of the country. They are true and good and distinguished men; have eminently served their party, in their respective spheres; but neither one nor both of them should be allowed to hold the favor of their party in their pockets, and let personal rivalry between them. There are fifty men in the State good and true as either of them. Let the conservative and Democratic representatives of the people stick to their colors—the interests of the party and country and let not personal considerations of any kind divert them.
