We take the liberty of making the following extract from a private letter received by us from our worthy friend, Mr. [Name] in the Legislature, of which is of interest to our readers.

Catawba Station, N. C.  
 Dec. 29th 1870.

You will see by the proceedings, that the General Assembly has adjourned to the 16th Jan. 1871.

I arrived home last Saturday.

The High Court of [Name] was organized last Friday by Chief-Justice Pears and the Court grant Holden to the 25th Jan. to prepare his defence. The managers, on the part of the House, will have six days thereafter to file their replication and then will set for the 30th Jan. the time granted Holden to prepare his defence. As you will observe, includes the time of our adjournment. We draw no per-diem during the recess, and consequently the time granted Holden will cost the State no money.

The trial so far has cost the State no money. The Senate during the trial, will sit only a few hours each day as a Court of Impeachment—will hold night sessions, and will in that way be able to keep up with the legislation of the House.

A Bill submitting the question of Convention to the people has passed the Senate, and two readings in the House, and would have passed its final reading but for the fact that so many members were absent &c., that it was thought best to have a full house on its final reading.

The Convention Bill will certainly pass immediately on the re-assembling of the Legislature.

I have seen two copies of the CAROLINA EAGLE and am highly gratified to see this further evidence of the enterprising spirit of your beautiful Town.

May the news of CAROLINA's vast resources fly on the wings of this "Eagle" throughout the broad lim-

its of the land, visiting the worthy and industrious to happy homes among us. Great success to the "Carolina Eagle" together with several of our friends will be in your place Jan. the 7th—the day on which you propose to organize an Agricultural and Mechanical Society.

(The course of Mr. Houston our Representative in the present Legislature is so far giving entire satisfaction. We wish him great success, and hope that his future course may be as consistent and useful as that of the past.—Ed.)
