But, if it is admitted that the capital stock of the bank is by its charter exempted from additional taxation, it is by no means follows that the dividends or profits of the individual stockholders shall be exempt.

The dividends are listed for taxation, and the tax is paid by the owners of the stock to the sheriff in the counties of their residence.

The tax on the capital stock is paid, irrespective of profits by the officers of the bank directly into the public treasury.
