We have been permitted to make the following extracts from letters of an old Ansonian, who, it will be perceived, has "pitched his tent" ing to Brazil the writer resided in Alabams. His letters, as will be seen, are quite interesting, and he seems to be content, so far. But we apprehend it will turn out with him as with many others. He will become weary of his self imposed exile and he will ore long return home to battle for his "birth right" under the Constitution :

CITY OF PARA, BRAZIL, Sept. 12, 1867.
