The Wagon Man. A newly appointed Constable received, a few mornings since - at a station below here - the following telegram:

Wadesboro, April 25. J. Constable:

Escape. Two of the prisoners confined in jail on a charge of Larceny, made their escape by cutting a hole in the over-head ceiling and taking out brick in the North gable end of the jail and fastening their blankets together, thus forming a way of descent. There were three in the room - the upper dungeon - the same herebefore noticed as having been engaged in mounting pinnacles on the highway and snatching money from them. They were first charged with Highway Robbery and a bill found against them for that crime was subsequently ignored, and a new bill sent out for Larceny which was found a true bill, by the Grand Jury. On application they were allowed to give bail in \$500 each, the bond to be justified before L. S. Hooper Judge Russell, fearing they could not make the bond satisfactorily, or that if they could it would not prove as serviceable as Leg-bail, they resorted to the latter.
