issued proclamations, warning the rioters to disperse, under the severest penalties for the continuance of the disorders. The fighting continued list night, the stones falling like hail. Dispatches' just received gives later news rom Belfast. The rioting still continues.-Four persons were killed in the streets this mornidg. Much complaint is made by the peaceable citizens against the authorities for

Rumans, with pistols in their hands, stalk through the city, and whole sections are given up to the rioters.

The populace are divided into hostile Catholie and Protestant mobs, and whenever they come in contact there is a fightantia Troops with fixed bayonets, and the police, in endeavoring to stop the disturbances. have been obliged to fire into the rioters on

both sides, and numbers were wounded. The Steamships Adriatic, Holland and Idaho, from New York for Liverpool, and Thuringa from New York for Hamburg, have arrived out. The Holland brings 4,974 bales of cotton, and the Adriatic 1,181 bales.
