The following official order has just been promulgated:

DEPARTMENT OF STATE. Washington, Jan'y 28th, 1873. Inquiries having been made from va-

rious quarters as to the application of the Executive order issued on the 17th of January, relating to the holding of State or municipal offices by persons holding civil offices under the federal government, the President directs the tollowing reply to be made :

"It has been asked whether the order prohibits a federal efficer from hold ag | Mail also the office of an Alderman, or of a Common Counci man of a city, or of a Town Counciman of a town or village, or of appointments under city, town or village governments. By some it has n suggested that there may be a dis traction made in case the office be with or without salary or compensation. The city or town offices of the description r ferred to, by whatever name they may be ocally known, whether held by election or by appointment, and whether with or without compensation, are of the class which the executive order intends not to be held by persons holding federal offices. It has been asked weether the order prohibits federal officers from holding positions on boards of education, school committees, public libraries, religious or eleemosynary institutions, incorporated, established or sustained by State or municipal authority. Positions and service on such boards or committees and professorships in colleges are not regarded as ffices within the interpetration of the Executive order, but as employments or service in which all good citizens may be engaged without incompatibility, and in many cases without interference, with any position which they may hold under the federal government. Officers of the tederal government may therefore engage in such services, provided the attention required by such employment does not interfere with the regular and efficient discharge of the duties of their office under the federal government .-The head of the department under whom the federal office is held will in all cases be the sole judge whether or not the employment does thus interfere. The question has also been asked with regard to offic rs of the State militia. Congress having exercised the power conferred by the constitution to provide for organizing the militis, which is liable to be called forth to be employed in the service of the United States, and is thus in some sense under the control of the general government, and is, moreover, of the greatest value to the public, the Executive order of the 17 h of January is not considered as prohibiting federal officers from being officers of the militia in the States and Territories. It has been asked

whether the order prohibits persons holding office under the tederal government being members of local or municipal Fire Departments; also whether it applies to mechanics employed by the day in the armories, arsenels and navy yards, &c., of the United States. Unpai i service in local or municipal Fire Departments is not regarded as an office within the intent of the Executive order, and may be performed by federal officers provided it do not interfere with the regular and efficient discharge


