FRIDAY, Jan'y 31, 1873. The Senate was called to order at 11 o'clock Lieutenant Governor Brogden in the chair.

Rules Suspended.

On motion of Mr Eilis, of Columbus, the substitute offered by the committee on the Insane Asylum, being a resolution to raise a Joint Select Committee, with Dr Engene Grissom, to proceed to Charlotte and Wilmington and inquire the cost of buildings and grounds for branches of the Lunatic Asylum, was Mail taken up.

Pending the discussion on the adoption of the resolution, the hour arrived for the special order.

At 121 o'clock the bill to alter the Constitution of North Carolina was taken up as the special order.

From his Excellency, the Governor, transmitting certain documents from the State of Virginia in regard to the action of the General Assembly of that State on Internal Improvements. The message with accompanying documents was referred to committee on Internal Improvements.


