Mr Grandy occupied the floor in opposition, stating that he had been misrepresented in the statement that he was opposed to Constitutional Amendments, but he was opposed to any alterations or amendments to that instrument at this time. It was not important, and the people did not demand a change. -If there were imperfections in the constitution, he would rather stand by them than to "fly to evils he knew not of," as this bill proposes. He referred to the clause in the constitution providing how it shall be changed or amended, and argued that the eighteen bills now offered were not in accordance therewith. He was here interrupted by Mr Morehead, of Guilford, who asked if he would vote for the original bill. Mr Grandy-no, sir. He thought the passage of the original bill was calculated to uproot the whole government of the State. To support the amendments, as they appear, he thought would be antagonistic to the law now existing, and would necessarily lead to revolution. A violation of one part was a violation of the whole, and he counseled Senators to avoid the dangerous ground they were


