STILL the European World goes mad over the "King of Kings." In England, even the Queen came to London to do him honor, and now in France the excitement seems intense.

"Princes of the royal house were presented to the Shah, and he treated them with such an indifference that under other circumstances it could never have been tolerated.

At Potsdam when the officer on duty came to bring him the morning report and to report that the troops were in readiness to receive him, he answered that he would give the order when the review was to take place, and he finally only witnessed the parade from the window.

On the arrival of the Shah the Persian gentlemen of his suite threw some "Kopecks" (Russian coin) to the workmen, who had helped to bring the luggage to the castle.

The New York Herald informs us that "the Second Auditor of the Treasury has just completed the settlement of the account of Jacob Thompson, Secretary of the Interior under Buchanan's administration, and acting at that time as trustee of the Indian fund.

— A dispatch received from Stanley's Yellowstone expedition, dated at camp seventy miles west of Bismarck, Dakota, June 30, states that the health of the whole command was good.

— The following Revenue Marine orders have been promulgated: Captain John A. Henriques is detached from the revenue steamer Chase, at New York, and ordered to special duty in the construction of the new revenue marine vessel at Boston and Portland.

— A Herald cable dispatch from London says the Herald correspondent at Khartoum telegraphs, via Alexandria, a confirmation of the arrival of Sir Samuel and Lady Baker and party.

WASHINGTON NOTES. The numbers of claims preferred against the United States is 478; against Great Britain, 19; number decided, 35; to be decided, 141.

Requisitions from the Post Office Department on its agents in New York for ordinary postage stamps to supply postmasters amounted on Saturday to \$4,000,000.

The President has transmitted for record the following appointments: Henry G. Worthington, Collector of Customs, Charleston, S. C.; Joseph Beale, Chief of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery, Navy Department, vice Palmer, resigned; W. W. Murray, United States Attorney for the western district of Tennessee.

The Fourth Auditor of the Treasury is about to distribute prize-money to the officers and crew of the United States steamer Sycamore for the capture of the Alicia. This was one of the early captures of the war, but owing to litigation the case has only recently been decided and thus made available to the captors.

Postmasters throughout the country are sending in their orders for supplies, it being the commencement of the first quarter of the fiscal year.
