The British steam sloop Niobe has arrived at Kingston, Jamaica, from Omoa, Honduras, bringing the following intelligence: General Estraba's troops, after assassinating the detachment of Palacio's forces, which, under a flag of truce, approached the fort, sacked Omoa, and imprisoned all the British subjects, gutted the Consulates of America, England, Spain and Portugal, tore the American flag to pieces and sacked the merchants' warehouses and safes, leaving them a perfect wreck.

Gratifying Intelligence from Africa. The American Geographical Society has received a highly important letter from Gaboon, on the West Coast of Africa, describing the operations of the German, English and French expeditions.

King Victor Emmanuel, from his little confidential conversation at Berlin with Prince Bismarck, has returned homeward, satisfied, most likely, that if the Bourbons of France undertake to turn the King out of Rome, they will rue the day.
