BY THE GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS, Official information has been

received at this Department that FRANK

MALPASS, late of the county of New Hanover,

over, stands charged with the murder of

Edward J. Walker of said county; and

that the said Malpass has fled the State, or

so conceals himself that the ordinary pro-

cess of law cannot be served upon him:

Now, therefore, I, TOB. R. CALDWELL,

Governor of the State of North Carolina, by

virtue of authority so vested by law, do

issue this my Proclamation offering a re-

ward of THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS

for the arrest and delivery of the said Frank

Malpass to the Sheriff of New Hanover

County, in the City of Wilmington, and I

do enjoin all officers of the law and all good

citizens of the State to aid in bringing said

criminal to justice.


