





By His Excellency, the Governor of North \ Carolina. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT,

Raleigh, October 22d, 1877,
WHEREAS, The people of North Carolina have been abundantly blessed during the past year, and the earth hath yielded bounteously of all the products of its soil so that the garners of the husbandman are filled to overflowing; and the industrious mechanic has realized a rich reward for his labor, and every class of our population prospered in all laudable enterprises; and WHEREAS above all, fraternal feelings and good will have in a great measure been restored in our midst, and no piague, peatience or famine has visited our State: Now, therefore, as it becomes us, a grateful people, to render thanks to Almighty God for these and numberless other blessings showered upon us in His great mercy, I, Tod R. Caldwell, Governor of North Carolina, in obedience to law and in conformity with Raleigh, October 22d, 1875. nor of North Carolina, in obedience to law and in conformity with an honored prece-dent, do appoint and set apart

Thursday, November 27th, 1873,

as a day of public Thanksgiving throughout the State; and I do earnestly invite the clef-gy of every denomination to open their respective houses of worship on said day, and to exhort their congregations to humble themselves before the throne of the ever living God, and render unto Him praises which are justly due, invoking for them-selves, their State and their whole country. His guidance and protection throughout all time to come.

"O come, let us sing unto the Lord, let us make a joyful noise to the Rock of our sal-"Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms."

Done at the city of Raleigh, on this the 22d day of October, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and in the ninety-eighth year of American Indones.
