



Raleigh, October 22d, 1873, Whereas, The people of North Carolina have been abundantly blessed during the past year, and the earth hath yielded bounteously of all the products of its soil so that the garners of the husbandman are filled to overflowing; and the industrious mechanic has realized a rich reward for his labor, and every class of our population prospered in has realized a rich reward for his labor, and every class of our population prospered in all laudable enterprises; and Whereaux, above all, fraternal feelings and good will bave in a great measure been restored in our midst, and no plague, postilence or famine, has visited our State: Now, therefore, as it becomes us, a grateful people, to render thanks to Almighty God for these and numberless other blessings showered upon us in His great mercy, I. Tod R. Caldwell, Governor of North Carolina, in obedience to law and in conformity with an honored precedent, do appoint and set apart

Thursday, November 27th, 1873,
