

They will also be transported, when r quired, to any considerable amounts(not less a kee, containing from 150 to 185 d d i.s.) either by land or water carriage, when such can be procured, to any part of the United States, at the expense and risk of the government, on the receipt of a deposit to the credit of the treasurer of the Uni ed States to the amount of the cents required, in the back of the United States or any of its offices, or in any State Bank which performs the duties of commissioner of loans, or agent for paying pensions, in those states where no office has een established. The deposites to the credit of the treasurer of the United States, in all cates, to be made in the same state to which the cents are required to be transported.


