provious condition of slavery or involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shalf have the same right to make and euforce contracts, to sue, be partias, and give evidence, to inherit, purchase, lease, sell and convey real and per sonal property, and to as full and equal benefit of all laws and proceedings for the secuity of persoss and property as enjoy ed by white cilizens, and shall be subjec to lise pupishreents, pains and penalte. and to mone ather; pay law, statule, ord nance, reguigtion
The penal system of the bill is retained providing that any person whe shall de prive any in this bill, shall be fined one thousand dollars, and imprisoned not less than one year An additional seetion is added to the bil providing for a final appeal in any case tha may arise to the Suprems: Cuart of the United States. Nothing in this act, however is to he so construed as to effect the laws of any State conreraing the right of suf. frage.
