The losses in the county where I live are so great this year that next year's dog tax will he over \$8 a deg. Many say they have no dog, and there are many ownerless animals, The mischief generally comes from .hese. How best to deal with them is a problem. Would it not be well as in some of our eities to have all dogs pay a yearly license -any one harboring a dog not paying lilicensed to be printed and posted in frequented places, village stores, hotels and and the public requested to report any dug or owner of a dog not on the list, the reporter to receive a small reward. Any dog straying around to be taken to the pound, and if not claimed within a specified fime, to be killed. The poundkeeper, or appointed dog-catcher, to receive a fee for each dog killed. The law in New Jersey only allows \$5 for a sheep or lamb killed by dogs, regardless of higher valuation by the appraisers. Where one has a well bred flock, this does not pay. GRAFTING WAX.

For grafting, take four peris of matton tallow, eight parts of rosin and two pa ts of beeswax Melt them togather over a slow fire. When thoroughly melted and mix-ed, pour the mixture off in small quantities into a tub of cold water; soon as the masses thus poured in the water coul down sufficiently to be handled, work processly in the same manner you would condy, by drawing out and doubling over, until the whole presents a uniform co'or, and be-comes hard enough to mould into sticks. This wax, when cold, hould be quite hard, but it ought to be tough at any ordinary temperature. If. however, it is found that for the section where it is to be used it is to o soft, more rosin must be used,

Salt should be given regularly; It is a very effective preventive of diseases; but t should be given moderately. It is only safe to trust to any animal?s instinct to choose its own supply, when salt is kept constantly before it; otherwise, in its greediness, it will be not to take too much. Straw is too valuable, to be used for lite ter. Plenty of material can be procured for this purpose which costs nothing, and is good for nothing else, such as leaves, coarse grass, weeds out before they blossom or seed, sand, dry earth, swamp muck, &c These should be gathered in good time, and stored under cover, or protected from the


