GRAHAM HIGH SCHOOL.

Among the pleasant incidents of our attendance on the late Alamance Superior Court was a visit to the Graham High School now under the charge of the Rev. D. A. Long.

The institute was originally incorporated as the Graham College by the Christian Church, the date of incorporation being about the year 1857.

It subsequently fell under difficulty, and in 1872, came into the hands of the present proprietor, the corporate name being also changed to conform to the present title.

As will be seen by the advertisement in another column, to which we refer incidentally, the faculty consists of the Rev. D. A. Long, A. M. the Rev. W. W. Staley, A. M. the Rev. W. S. Long, A. M. and Miss Jennie Albright.

MAY 1, 1878, TO APRIL 30, 1879. UNDER THE Revised Statutes of the U.
