The Care Required in Loading an Ocean Liner.

To watch the loading of grain either from an elevator or lighter into one of the mammoth vessels engaged in its transportation, is to witness one of the chief operations in the movements of the world's commerce, says a writer in Donahoe's Magazine.

The "trimming" of the grain in the holds is an important part of its storage. After several thousand bushels have streamed into the hold, a dozen or more men are delegated to shovel the downpouring column in between the vessel's beams, a job for which they are paid at the rate of one cent a minute.

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DR. TALMAGE'S CAREER.

Hear His Lecture, "The Bright Side of Things," at the Normal.

Of Dr. Talmage, who comes to the State Normal and Industrial School on Wednesday night, the 17th, we have the following sketch of his life from one who has known him during all that time.

Dr. Talmage was born January 7th, 1832, at Bound Brook, N. J. His parents were persons of pure Christian character, the fruits of whose judicious training were manifest in the conversion of DeWitt when 18 years of age.

On graduation day, when he delivered his speech at Niblo's Garden, the effect was electric and overwhelming; the most of the audience rising to their feet, under the spell of his brilliant, original, methodical and pathetic utterances.

During the time Dr. Talmage was pastor of this church he directed the building of three great edifices at a cost of nearly \$1,000,000.

Not long ago he received a call to preach in the Presbyterian church in Washington, attended by the President, and now, each Sunday the church is packed to its utmost capacity.
