**POSSEMEN GO UNPAID IF NO STILLS ARE CAPTURED.**

Hereafter possemen adding United States revenue collectors will not receive pay unless the raid that they are engaged in is successful. Heretofore guides and possemen have been paid from \$2 to \$5 per day and many raids were undertaken upon evidence that was not reliable, as all civilians who inform collectors of supposed illicit stills are hired to guide the officers and help in the raid. Hence the tendency was to take the chance of making the money without there being any foundation for the idea that there was an illicit still in the neighborhood.

This new ruling, which has just been issued by the commissioner of internal revenue, declares that "beginning October 1 no guide or posseman should be employed to assist officers in raiding illicit distilleries unless it be distinctly understood that payment for services performed is contingent on the seizures or destruction of an illicit still. In other words, prior to employing a guide or posseman he should be informed that if the raid results in no seizure or destruction of an illicit still no payment will be made for his services and the trip will be entirely at his own expense. This understanding should be clear before his employment." The wages will remain the same, however, and when a raid is successful the possemen will receive \$3 to \$5 a day for each day.
