PRO. ANTI. AND FERRELL.

WHAT IS HIS POLITICS.

While Mr. J. J. Ferrell's card was written almost exclusively upon the idea that a majority of the people are anti-prohibitionists, yet it is apparent to the careful observer that he aims his thrusts at the Democratic party.

Mr. Ferrell has never yet answered anything THE PLANT has said of him; because it was truth, and though he may say privately it is untrue, it is due the people that he should come out publicly and meet the proof which is ready for him if he wishes to put in a denial.

There is a striking similarity in the methods of dishonest officials, whether of the General Government or of States—a fact that he can plainly illustrate by comparing some recent exposures in the Philadelphia Press of peculations by State officials in Pennsylvania with the frauds in the office of the custodian of the Public Treasury, recently brought to light in Washington.

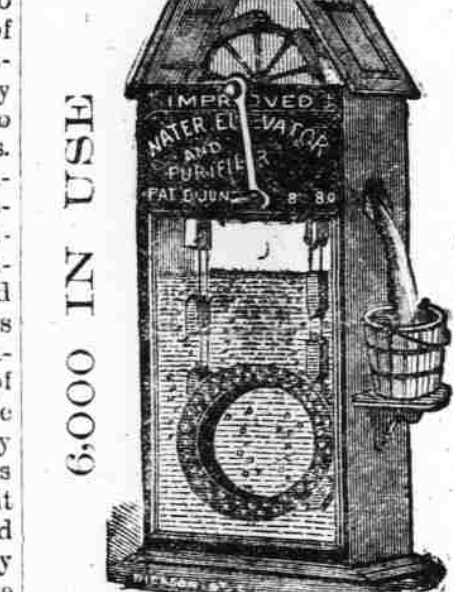
