Hello again. The players have been selected for the All Smoky Mountain Conference Football team. The choices this year were most difficult with the abundance of talent throughout the conference; these choices were especially hard when electing the offensive backfield since each coach wanted to place his own "prize stock" in the line-up.

Unfortunately some of the better players were elected in position other than ones they played. Perhaps you recall our all conference defensive halfback, Ronnie Ledford, in last year's elected team.
