Black Knights Enter Class "A" Playoff

Robbinsville High's Black Knights begin defense of their Class "A" State Football Championship here Saturday night when they meet the Rosman High Tigers in WCU's Memorial Stadium. The kickoff is slated for 8:00 p.m. with an admission charge of \$2.00 for adults and \$1.25 for students. Robbinsville brings a 7-2 record into the playoffs with losses to AA schools, Murphy and Swain County. The Black Knights have not lost a Class A game since 1968. Coach Bobby Colvin's team is led by the passing combination of quarterback Mark Manuel to Lionel Snider. Manuel has over 1,500 yards through his air this season. Rosman has a 6-2 regular season record and has lost only one "A" game in two years. The Tigers look to tailback Ronnie Joe Owens, halfback Jimmy McCall, quarterback Jimmy Hall and tight end Ralph Johnson for offensive leadership. Owens has rushed for 1,005 yards with McCall right behind with over 700 yards. Hall, only 5-3, 118 pounds, has passed for eight scores and has run for two more. Johnson, a 6-4, 205 pound junior, has caught five touch-down passes.

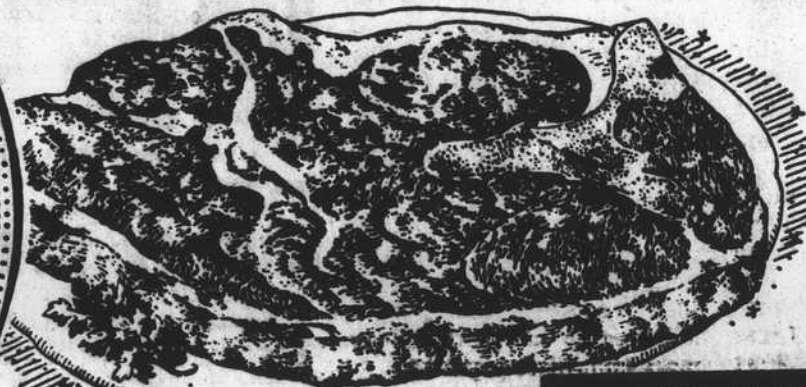
