"We will continue to expand and to look for new and better forms of employment that will bring a better standard of living for each Indian family. The tribal employment will be upgraded," the platform reads. The support and pressure, if necessary, of agencies concerned with roads on the Boundary.

Law and order will receive whole-hearted support, as will all Indian organizations that are for the betterment and prosperity of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and other Indians in the United States. Other candidates may run for the tribe's top offices as unofficial candidates. Powell has been acting chief since the death this spring of Principal Chief Walter S. Jackson.

**GREATER PATIENT SAFETY**

Ouch! That hurts! Any ten-year-old could tell you that when you step squarely upon a "rock in your shoe" you will feel a predictable degree of pain. Naturally, in a case like this, you would stop and remove the painful rock and continue more comfortably upon your way, and the problem would be over.

But suppose two medicines you are taking caused an undesirable interaction. If the reaction were sudden and painful enough for you to notice, you'd probably stop the dosage immediately. On the other hand, if the reaction were slow and unnoticeable, you would not be compelled to stop taking the dosage. In this case, you could possibly suffer severe damage from long-term interaction.

The point is this. Pharmacists are becoming increasingly alarmed at the interactions between certain drugs. There exists a need to record all pharmacy dispensed medicines. Consequently, many of us are turning to the maintenance of up-to-date family and individual medication records to head off the effects of drug interactions.

In the meantime, patients are always encouraged to inform both Physicians and Pharmacists of any drugs they may have been taking. With this cooperation, your safety from undesirable drug interactions can be assured.
