Hoist the Same old Flag!

> FOR THE COURIER. MARION July 20th 1874.

MR. EDITOR .- We left Hickory Station on the 17th, and wended our way to Pleasant Garden, a beautiful and romantic place. Situated 5 miles from Marion. Buck Creek a beautiful stream flows within a few yards of the Hotel.

The walks are beautifully laid off bordered with box, spruce-pine and various kinds of shrubbery. The hotel is a large building with several co'tages attached, there were between 20 and 30 visitors, among the curiosities 'exhibited was a large rattle snake .-On our route from Marion to Pleasant Gardens the scenery presented to our view was grand and beautiful, we had a fine view of the "Sable rock and Roane Mountains." We crossed the beautiful Catawba river. After spend ing a few days at Pleasant Gardens, we find ourselves at Marion, the county seat of McDowell, an elevated and healthy location; the air pure and bracing. This morning we ascended mount "Ida" a mountain about a quarter of a mile from the hotel, about a mile in height,- where we had fine view of the village and surrounding country.

July 22ml, 874. Our party has just returned from Old Fort, the present terminus of the Western N. C. R. R., the road is graded several miles beyond Old Fort on the route to Asheville. There hav ng been some question raised as to the meaning of the election laws, relating to the boxes necessary to be used in county el ctions, and judicial elections, the undersiged having been many times applied to, for a opinion construe the same as follows:

1. In county elections, but one box should be used for county offlicers, including Clerk of the Superior Court.

2. In judicial election, but one box should be used for judge and solicitor in those district where both of such officers are voted for; and but one box, of course where only solicitor are voted for. But one bailot should be put in each

Remember that the election law requires "That when a voter is challenged at the polls upon demand of any citizen of the State it shall be the duty of Inspectors of Elections to require said voter before being allowed to vote to prove by the oath of some other person known to these Judges the fact of his residence for thirty days previous thereto in the county in which he purposes to

Remember also that the election law says "No elector shall be entitled to register or vote in any other precinct or township than the one in which he is an actual or bona fide resident on the day of election, and no certificate of regstration shall be given.
