### CHAPEL HILL.

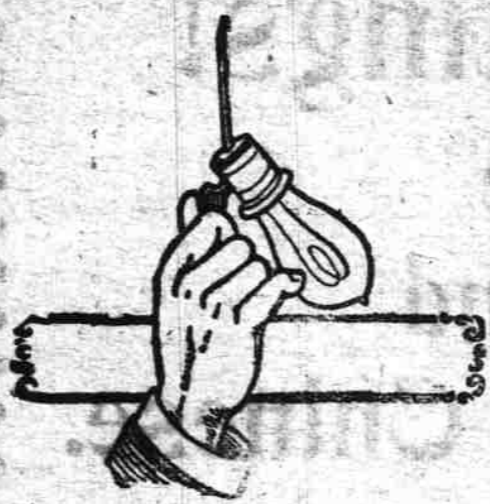
Chapel Hill, Jan. 28.

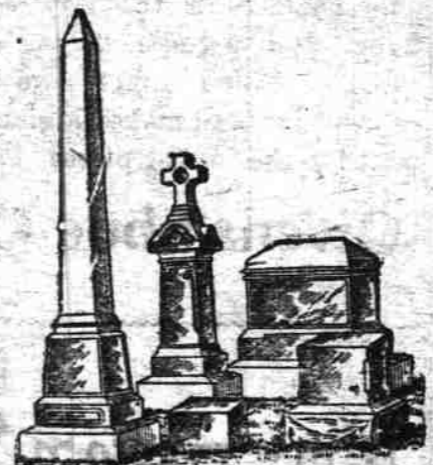
