will then be able to get our early truck to the northern markets early enough in the season to compete with truck from all other sections, in fact our truck will be earlier by a considerable time than that of Maryland, Delaware and New Jersey.

In the matter of highways, there is no need to dilate upon the condition of North Carolina roads. At least those in the eastern and lower part of the state.
