**MISS HARRELL  
NEARLY DROWNS**

Columbia, June 8 1909.—Last week Mrs. James Harrell, Mrs. Bush Harrell, Miss Florida Harrell and Mr. Forrest Liverman went for a fishing trip on the Scuppernon river which came near ending fatally. In the afternoon, while the party were enjoying the sport a sudden thunder storm appeared in the West. Mr. Liverman who is an expert oarsman noting the rapid advance of the storm proceeded to row the party to shelter and in the excitement of the moment the boat came in contact with an unobserved pile and as a result of the collision Miss Florida Harrell who was seated in the extreme bow of the boat was hurled headlong into the water. Mr. Liverman recognizing the perilous position of the young lady plunged overboard and after diving in 15 feet of water succeeded in bringing her to the surface. The other occupants of the boat became so excited as to be unable to render any assistance and it was with the greatest difficulty that he was able to keep the struggling girl and himself above water. Mr. Ed Littlejohn and some companions who happened to be rowing in the vicinity saw the accident and rushed to the rescue and succeeded in placing the half drowned lady in the boat. Miss Harrell's escape from a watery grave was indeed narrow and should be a warning to those especially who can not swim, to be more careful in handling boats in deep water.

The Board of Town Aldermen held its first meeting since the election Monday evening in the Court House, a full Board being present with the exception of Alderman Davenport, who has been absent. The Board elected S. M. Combs clerk and Robert Knight City Treasurer and placed a license tax of \$1.00 upon boot blacks. In the election of a town constable in the place of Robert Dillen resigned, the board after several ballots showed a deadlock and the matter over until the next meeting. Several bills were audited and much routine business transacted.

Dr. Spruill of the board of health appeared before the board and gave a detailed report of the sanitary condition of the city. He said that he had made a careful investigation in which he had found the conditions in most respects very satisfactory, yet there remained much to be done, most important of which was the drainage in some of the streets of the town. We can, said the doctor neglect for a time at least the question of electric lights, paved streets or other public utilities, but we can not and must not neglect the health of our citizens. With the warm weather upon us the danger of an epidemic becomes more and more evident and we must take every precaution to prevent the possibility of such a calamity. The question was laid over until the next meeting when proper action will be taken in the matter. The board adjourned until next Monday evening June 14.
