Boston Club Women Plan House

The club women of Boston are interesting themselves in a club house for undergraduate girl students.

The club house comprises two separate three-story apartments thrown together. On the first floor are the dining rooms and offices on the second are the rest and study rooms and the remainder of the space is given over to sleeping rooms, of which there are 14.

At present there are twenty girls living at the club house and paying from \$7 to \$10 a week for room and board.

The club is open to any girl student of good standing in the higher schools of Boston.

Afternoon tea is served free, and a member may bring a friend for 10 cents extra.

Councilwomen.

Six women will be candidate for the London County Council at the coming election, the first at which women have been eligible.

Twenty years ago, when the County Council was first organized, Miss Jane Cobden and Lady Margaret Sandhurst were elected in London.

Beresford Hope, whom Lady Sandhurst defeated, contested the election on the ground that women were not eligible and in spite of public opinion succeeded in ousting her.

Miss Tye Leung has the distinction of being the first Chinese woman to receive a Federal appointment. She has been appointed assistant to the matron in charge of the new immigration station on Angel Island, San Francisco.

Hundreds of Chinese, men and women are detained at this station pending their admission into the U. S., and it was decided that a Chinese

woman would be of great assistance to the matron.

The occidental board of foreign missions was asked to recommend some one and named Tye Leung. She is a Japanese woman at the head of the institution where the mothers of most of the babies are serving sentences in prison.

The other day nurse is in Yokohama and is managed by an English woman.

A third is being arranged for in Okayama a large factory town, by Miss Adams a missionary, who has recently returned from her American home.

Trial of Gold

Mrs. Russell Sage is said to have distributed more than \$150,000 during her recent trip through Texas.

The little town of Uvalde received \$20,000 for an orphan asylum and school; El Paso \$25,000 for a hospital fund; Brackettville \$15,000 toward the fund of \$50,000 for a sanitarium which it is struggling to raise; Pecos, \$15,000 for a school fund, and Boerne \$10,000 for a sanitarium.

Other small places received from \$1,000 to \$3,000 each for hospitals or schools.

Duties Reversed

Before the recent Chicago election Miss Lucy Page Gaston, of the Anti-Cigarette League, and Mrs. Emily Hill, president of the Cook County Woman's Christian Temperance Union, attended meetings of fall Protestant denominations and asked the clergymen to enlist the aid of their wives against the liquor traffic.

As a result some of the clergymen dusted, made beds and cooked for one day while their wives went out to fight against the saloons.

Uses of Apples.

A cupful of grated apples of superior quality may be used to flavor ice cream.

Grated apples are sometimes added to pancake batter.

Better yet, however are the sweet pancakes and waffles spread with a thin layer of apple sauce flavored with lemon.

Melted apple jelly flavored with quince may be used instead of the sauce.
