FARM NOTES OF INTEREST

LIFE SCHOOLS.

The North Carolina Farmers' Educational and Cooperative Union which held its annual meeting at the A. & M. College Raleigh July 26-27 took a decided stand for the establishment of farm life schools. The report of the Committee on Education which was adopted unanimously is here given in full. This report it may be added is in exact accord with the ideas of State Superintendent Joyner and there is little reason to doubt that the second part of it which relates to farm-life instruction in the rural high schools will sooner or later be enacted into legislation.

it will be noted that no new school machinery or system ofschools is asked for nor is there any demand that the recognized cultural studies shall be displaced by the prac tical. The plan suggested is to comhine the cultural and the practical in the same school. In this respect the relative, wise and practical. In order to put into effect the plan proposed the Union pledges to the school authorities its hearty suppert and cooperation. What this support may mean can be judged from the fact the Union which by the way is not a political organization is now composed of more than 70,000 of State. Here is a great army of earnthe most progressive farmers of the est men deeply and seriously interestel in our educational development pledging their support and cooperation. Their influence is going to count mighthy in the upbuilding of the sysnow developing. It is needless to add they are going to get what they are asking for.

Report of the Committee on Education.

Notwithstanding the fact that North Carolina is one of the original thirteen colonies yet we not with regret that we are far behind some of the younger states in the development of our resources; especially our agriculture Our swamp lands remain undrained: our piedmont hillsides are dotted with unsightly uullies; our mountain section ha lost untold wealt by the wanton detruction of its valuable timber. Eighty per cent of our peo pie are living upon the farms yet only a mall per cent know anything about their own soil condition needs of different crops, etc. thereby failing to have the essentials necessary to the full development of a high order of citizenship. We believe that a better knowledge of the practical science of agriculture on the part of the great masses of people living in the cural districts will not only add comfort to happiness in all of the now desolate homes but will also add untold wealth to our grand old common-

Those communities and those state that have given their children a special education for farm life are living in the most comfort are making the best crops are best developing and conserving their resources and are at the same time rearing a most contented and useful citizenship. In the light of what is being done in other states and from a careful study of our own needs and from thoughtful consideration of our present educa- bladder. tional requirements we are convinced of the necessity of specifically training our children for farm life. Along with their general education these children should be taught how to keep their homes sanitary and beautiful how to manage their househould and how to cooperate with one another in marketing crops and in getting full value for their products. If they are taught these essentials they will be enabled from their farms to meet the growing demands of ever-increasing population and to live with a full measure of comfort. Therefore to begin the fulfillment of these ends we recommend the following plan:

That we urge the enforcement of the present State law requiring ariculture to be taught in the comschools and that this be done with the best possible facilities. To accomplish this important step we re oumend.

First, that each county union appoint a standing committee of forcefel men to co-operate with the county Superntondent of education in seeing that this is faithfully done.

Second, that our State Union through an educational committee co-operate with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction in furthering this end and in devising practical means for making the teaching most

Fourth. We also recommend that in connection with the larger schools small demonstration farms or gardens be cultivated for instructive purposes

Second that in connection with these schools a farm for practical demonstration of best tgricultural practice be conducted and also provision be made for teaching the girls household science and that this subject be taught in the best modern

Third that a comfortable but inexpensive dormitory for boarding pupils and a teachers home be erected at each of these schools in order that the teacher may be in charge of the farm all of the year and that boys tem of puble high schools the State and girls from all parts of the country may secure boarding accommo- To the Democratic voters of Pasdations at actual cost.

Fourth. We recommend and urge that the General Assembly increase the State appropriation for public Sheriff of Pasquotank County schools sufficiently to provide for the development of the best high school into such a farm life school, with such courses of instruction as may be necessary in counties that will meet the conditions necessary for the successful maintenance and equipmen of such a farm life high school and further that in order to enable counties to meet these conditions the General Assembly do enact a law permitting such counties as desire such schools to vote upon a proposition to levy a small special tax on property and polls sufficent to provide the necessary equipment in land and buildings and to provide annually at least one half the necessary funds for the maintenance of the schools the other part of the funds for annual maintenance to be supplied out of the special State appropriation.
