LOWER PRICES SHOULD COME

Lower prices for meats and other foods should be the result of the bumper crops which the United States has produced this year, in the opinion of Secretary of Agriculture, Wilson.

"We have had bumper crops," he said today, "and great prices should come down; that is, if no combine is formed among the dealers. My views apply to all kinds of meat. The crops have been such that a falling in price is the inevitable result. The only thing that can defeat this will be of too great a toll is taken after the products leave the hands of the farmers and before they reach the consumers."
