STREET PAVING COMES TO HALT

Resolution Declares That All Contracts are at an End.

At a recent meeting of the Board of Aldermen, all movements to pave the streets of Elizabeth City, were called off, when the Board passed the following resolutions:

Resolved, that being unable to sell the bonds, it is hereby declared that all street paving contracts shall come to an end and that the thousand dollars held by D. M. Jones, chairman of the street paving committee be returned. This resolution was passed after attorney Edwards, of Asheville, had appeared before the Board in an attempt to negotiate the bonds and had failed to do so. For the time being, at least, it is conceded that all progress on plans to start the work of street paving has come to a halt. It is very likely that a special enactment will be secured in the next session of the State Legislature by which more salable bonds can be issued, then the work will be renewed.

The oyster commissioners of North Carolina and Virginia and the State geologist will also be present.
