To Discuss Plans For Needed Legislation to the Oyster Industry.

President Lamb of the Chamber of Commerce has issued a call for an Oyster Convention to meet here on the 28th of this month.

The purpose of this convention is to discuss the oyster industry with a view of making plans for needed legislation, which, it is hoped, wil be secured during the next session at the State Legislation.

A number of prominent oyster men will be here to discuss the situation.
