





"Under the old declaration every one of the States had retained each for itself, the right of manumitting all slaves by an ordinary act of legislation. By degrees the privileged class took from the people the power over slavery through their legisla tures and imposed legal and constitutional obstructions. As territory after territory were annexed, the struggle between free and involuntary labor waxed warmer. Oregon was annexed at length with the spplication of the Jefferson dictum and then California followed and chose freedom, and at the news Calhoun thought he heard the death knell of parting slavery. Washington and Jefferson and Madison had died despairing of slavery; Calhoun died despairing at the growth of freedom and counselling secession. 
