John G. Smith.
The subject of this sketch departed this life rather suddenly yesterday morning at 2 o'clock, in the 76th year of his age. Though Mr. Smith had been in feeble health for some years, he had only been confined to his room two days prior to his death, and was walking about in the house the evening before the final summons came.

Road Supervisor for Robeson.
Raleigh, N. C., March 7.—William G. Allen, for the past year supervisor of Wake's roads, and for many years superintendent of the county home, is elected road supervisor of Robeson. He accepts and takes charge April 1st. His salary is \$1,700.—Special to Wilmington Messenger.

"Robeson county is to be congratulated in securing the services of Mr. Allen, as he is one of the best road men in the State. He was for some time supervisor of the Wake county roads and their condition is sufficient evidence of his ability to build roads."
