After serving ten years and seven-outen days in a Mexican prison for killing a policeman of that country at Parral, Mex. Stewart day reached the United States, a free man, on a pardon from President Diaz.

Every effort possible to free him was resorted to by his friends, but the Texas Legislature had to ask the clemency of President Diaz before the old soldier, who served in the Confederate army, was freed.

He is the first American ever given a presidential pardon in Mexico. Stewart says he is in good health and expects to live many years longer.
