An Eight Dollar Bill.

Courtesy Holmes, of Burlington, has in his possession an old \$8 bill of the Continental currency of 1778. It is a small piece of rough, white paper, not over 3 1/2 inches, now yellow with age, and very poorly printed.

On the front is a round emblem and an inscription in Latin, with the words, "United States of America" across the top. To the right of the emblem are the words: "This bill entitles the bearer to receive eight Spanish milled dollars, or the value thereof in gold or silver, according to a resolution passed by congress at Philadelphia, September 26, 1774." On the back is a design in three tobacco leaves and the words: "Printed by Hall & Sellers, 1778."

Ancient Salt Currency.

In various countries anciently and is some eastern ones down to the present time, salt has been recognized as a medium of exchange. Cosmas speaks of a salt currency as being in use in the heart of Africa in the sixth century. Marco Polo in his work "Concerning the Kingdoms and Marvels of the East" written in the thirteenth century, tells us the Tibetans had none of the great khan's paper money, but used salt instead. Their mode of change was made thus: They had salt, which they boiled and set in a mold that below and above, and every piece from the mold weighed half a pound. On these molds the price's mark was set and none but the royal officers speedily appointed was permitted to make it. Eighty of these molds were reckoned to be equal to a "saggio of fine gold."

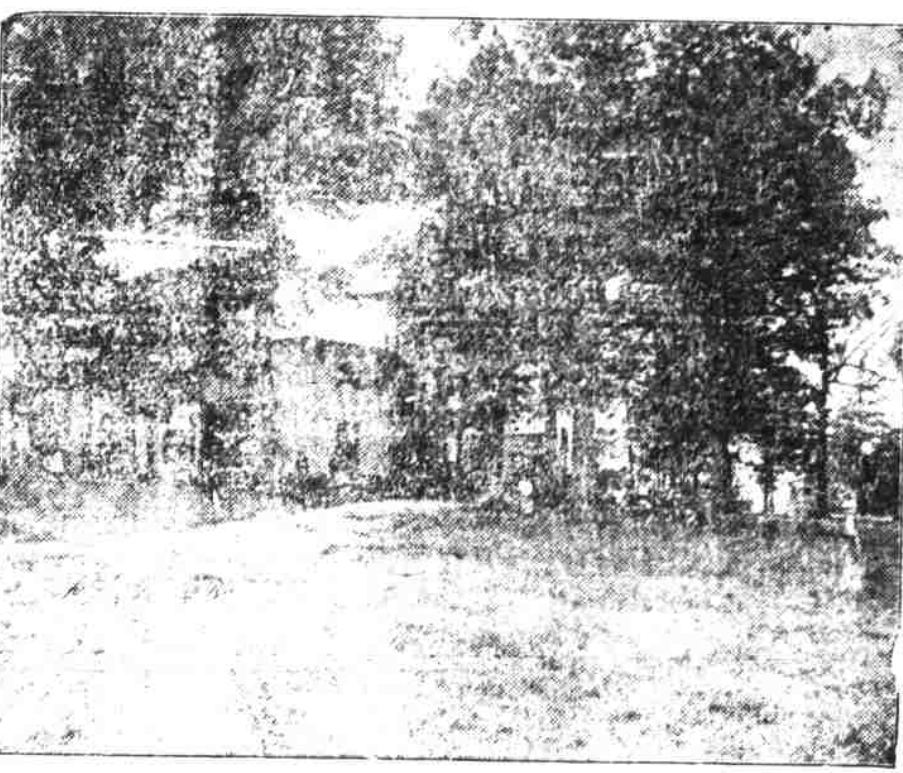
